A secure website has a symbol that looks like a little lock on it. Never give out your credit/debit card number to someone purporting to suspect suspicious activity in your account. Never give out the three digit number on the back of your credit card to a merchant that you don't know. Never respond to a "phishing" email you receive asking for your bank account number or personal information. Always shred or burn financial statements; never put them in your garbage. If you suspect suspicious activity, or lose a credit card, place a fraud alert with your credit card company and the three major credit reporting agencies. Opt out of "pre-approved" offers of credit at www.optoutprescreen.com . Obtain periodically free credit reports at www.annualcreditreport.com. The more of these rules you know, the safer you will be from identity theft.
